







<p>Digital Talking Books (DTB)</p> 		<p>Talking Book and Braille Library (TBBL)</p> <p>Free program providing digital talking books and Braille materials to anyone with a print disability.</p>	<p>Information and applications online http://www.nysl.nysed.gov/tbbl/ or call (800) 342-3688</p> <p>Library staff is happy to assist with the application process. B&ECPL does not circulate digital talking books or service digital readers.</p>
<p>NVDA Screen reader</p> 		<p>Software that reads aloud content displayed on a computer screen. (Free software similar to JAWS)</p>	<p>Central library Assistive Technology Room (ATR) workstation. Sign-in with ID.</p> <p>Training required to use this software is not available from library staff.</p>
<p>Pebble Enlarger</p> 		<p>Hand-held magnification device 4.3" screen with adjustable magnification of 1.25x - 13.5x</p>	<p>Available at Clarence Public Library.</p>

<p>Print/Braille books</p> 		<p>Children’s picture books with standard printed pages and clear plastic Braille overlays. A Blind and sighted person can enjoy a book together. Also useful for learning about Braille.</p>	<p>Central Library children's collection. Circulate the same as books in standard format.</p> <p>Find titles using the library catalog. Search “series” and “Braille Book Club”</p>
<p>SARA – Stand-Alone Reading Appliance</p> 		<p>Easy-to-use stand-alone text to voice scanner. Monitor displays text as it is read making the device helpful for persons with dyslexia or who are learning English.</p>	<p>Central Library Assistive Technology Room (ATR). Sign-in with ID.</p> <p>Device can be sent to other B&ECPL libraries upon request.</p>
<p>Text Magnifier</p> 		<p>Tabletop device that displays the enlarged image of print materials on an attached monitor. Size of display and contrast are adjustable.</p>	<p>Central Library Whisper Space. No sign-in is required. Easy for anyone to use. Other locations are Audubon, Aurora, Clarence, Clearfield, Eggert, Hamburg, Kenmore, Newstead, Orchard Park, City of Tonawanda, and Williamsville.</p>

Sign-in with ID.</p> <p>Training required to use software is not available from library staff. Software user guide is available.</p>
<p>ZoomText Keyboard</p> 		<p>Easy to see in low light. Has 36-point text and high-contrast color scheme. This keyboard also has Braille key overlays.</p>	<p>Central Library Assistive Technology Room (ATR) workstation.</p>
